Looking forward to 2024, we have one important date change to make you aware of: the summer **INSET day for 2024 is changing from July 5<sup>th</sup> to July 12<sup>th</sup>.** Another event to look forward to in 2024 is the school production of *Beauty and the Beast* (performances are on March 19<sup>th</sup> to March 22<sup>nd</sup> 2024); this year we have our largest cast and crew involved in the production, and while it is wonderful to see participation growing across all years, we are aware that although some students are thrilled to be embarking on developing character roles for this production, there have been a few disappointments and I would encourage everyone to focus on the importance of being a part of the Beauty and the Beast team and all the fun that will bring over the coming weeks and months.

At this point in the year the days are already starting to get shorter, and the weather is now starting to cool off too, so I would encourage students to wear a waterproof and warm coat to school. We welcome brightly coloured coats to make students more visible as they will soon be going home in the dark, especially those who cycle to and from school, who also need lights on their bikes and a bike helmet. We are always happy to help support the cost of helmets to ensure students have them.

At Bramcote College we have always felt that strong home-school links are important and links with our wider community and I just wanted to highlight some ways in which the school can support students and families through the current cost of living crisis. Over recent years we have introduced our 'Ask for Susie' project, where students and parents / carers can ask Reception if they have something for Susie and be given a supply of sanitary items (various items are available) for free. Nationally 'Period Poverty' is a real concern, with girls missing school at their time of the month because of the cost of sanitary items; at Bramcote College we do not want this to be a barrier to learning, so we have a year-round supply of items available. In addition to this we also run three 'Uniform Swap shops' per year, which allows parents / carers and students to come along and either, donate, swap or pick up items of pre-loved uniform that they may need, we will be running one of these before the Christmas break and will post dates and times on our social media (Facebook). We also offer uniform financial support on request (please contact your child's Head of Year, or Jo Cooper). Finally, we are always happy to support with the costs of trips, residentials, music tuition etc to make sure that our students have the opportunity to get fully involved in their school experience (please also contact your child's Head of Year, or Jo Cooper).
