

Dear Parents and Carers,

It seems amazing to find ourselves at the end of the first full term of this new school year already and contemplating the New Year and all that may bring. I am always appreciative of our students and our wider Bramcote College community. This term has brought many reasons to be proud to be at Bramcote College, from the ordinary day to day commitment that our students show in the work they do in their lessons and homework, to the welcome return of a range of extra-curricular activities and trips and, of course, the events our staff, students and PTA have put on to welcome parents and carers into the school. A few highlights of this term have included trips to Colwick with Year 7 and London for History, Art and Photography students, the Performing Arts Christmas concert, D of E expeditions and an ever-growing range of sports fixtures. In addition to this, we have enjoyed the PTA Christmas market and look forward to our Business Studies students' Christmas Market at the end of this week. There really has been something for everyone this term!

With all the festivities and preparation for the Christmas break, we remain very mindful that the cost of living crisis is very real and we are trying to support our community in as many ways as possible. We continue to be a member of the National Schools Breakfast scheme, providing bagels in tutor time on a daily basis and offering weekend packs for students to collect from the canteen on a Friday at the end of school. As long as the scheme continues we will participate. In addition to this, we have aimed to tackle what the media call 'period poverty' with our 'Something for Susie' scheme, where students and parents / carers will be given a choice of sanitary items if they ask for something for Susie at reception. We are also into our second year of running our Uniform Swap Shop, with pre-loved uniform, PE kit, coats and some hardly worn shoes / trainers. In addition to this our 'glam squad' led by Mrs Crouch are planning a pre-loved Prom store, so much-admired dresses, suits, shoes and bags can make another Prom appearance. We do, of course, continue to offer support for new school uniform items, as well as trips and events when requested.

Mindful of the cost of living, and without wanting to sound un-festive, we have made the decision not to have a Christmas jumper day due to the financial and potential environmental cost of buying new jumpers. To get into the Christmas spirit, we are running several events in school, including the Business studies Christmas market and Performing Arts Christmas concert, which I've mentioned already. We will also have a reverse advent calendar next week, where students will be asked to bring donations for our Hope food Bank collection, the PTA are putting on their annual Christmas disco for Year 7 and 8 students and the canteen staff will be cooking Christmas lunch for all students who have ordered it.
