| Staff Adaptation | Staff may choose to wear masks. Staff are asked to monitor ventilation in the classrooms they are using. Good hand hygiene and social distancing are encouraged. | Staff may choose to wear masks. Be aware of ventilation on classrooms & offices. Be conscious of social distancing when in a room for longer periods of time e.g. in the staffroom. Good hand hygiene. | Staff will be asked to start to wear facemasks again in school (unless they are exempt from wearing a mask). Ventilation, hygiene & social distancing are important routines to maintain. | Staff (unless they are exempt) will be expected to wear masks in school at all times. Other routines must be maintained. Social distancing will be increased. Staff meetings / training will resume on Teams. More online teaching may be required. |
| Student Adaptation | Students may choose to wear masks in and around school. Students are expected to maintain good hand hygiene. Students must not close windows in classrooms. School no contact policy. | Students may choose to wear masks in and around school. Students are expected to maintain good hand hygiene. Students must not close windows in classrooms. School no contact policy. | Students will be asked to start to wear facemasks again in communal areas such as corridors and dining hall (unless they are exempt from wearing a mask). | Masks will be required in classrooms, as well as communal areas. Contact tracing may result in bubbles of students working from home with online lessons. |
| Guidance when reporting a case & how the school will respond | Parents/Carers are asked to report any positive student cases to Rosie Bosley & form tutors by email. Staff are asked to contact Heidi Gale. (Staff will be sending work home for students to do if well enough). Under 18s or double vaccinated over 18s are not expected to isolate if a close contact / household member has tested positive /has symptoms. They are, however, asked to have a negative PCR before coming to school and to LFT regularly. | | As outlined before, however, should clusters of cases start to become apparent in tutor groups or social groups the school may need to contact trace and possibly send some groups home to self-isolate to reduce potential transmissions. Online lessons will be made available to students, following students' timetables. Government guidance on self-isolation may change should cases rise e.g. in winter months. | |
| Preparation of next stage in graduated response | While the school is not currently required to complete track and trace which results in groups or bubbles of students being sent home to work, teachers are asked to produce seating plans which students are expected to stick to. | Staff and students need to be aware that at the next level masks may be reintroduced for staff and for students in public areas e.g. corridors & dining hall. | Confirm seating plans in support of potential contact tracing in school. Students may need to work from home. | We will follow Government advice which will be outlined should case levels rise – this may include a period of home learning, or it may include an extended half term break |
