Outstanding results across all subjects in our broad and balanced Curriculum

- Accelerating progress
- 78% of students achieved Grade 4+ in English
- 64% of students achieved Grade 5+ in English
- 79% of students achieved Grade 4+ in Maths
- 64% of students achieved Grade 5+ in Maths
- 69% of students achieved Grade 4+ in both English & Maths
- 55% of students achieved Grade 5+ in both English & Maths
- 12% of students achieved 5 or more Grades 7 to 9 (A/A*)
- Highly successful exam results were also achieved in Art, Photography, Biology, Chemistry, Business Studies, Computing, Sport to name just a few subjects.





Work hard • Be well • <u>Do well</u> at BC6F

- In an average year almost 90% of BC6F students get into their first choice university
- 77% of students achieved A*- C grades in 2019; this has risen to 85% in 2022, with 28% of all grades being A*/A
- Average class sizes for A level groups are 8
- Students go on to a range of universities including Cambridge, Nottingham, Liverpool, Loughborough
- Students have also secured higher level apprenticeships with the NHS, the Police, Experian and Rolls Royce to name just a few
