Year Group: Year 13	Subject: A Level English Literature: AQA Lit A /7712
Objectives/purpose	To gain an A level qualification in English Literature To explore a relevant, engaging and an up-to-date study of literature. We encourage students to be independent and critical learners in their study of a range of texts. Students will be equipped to make interpretations of texts within their social and historical contexts, whilst also making connections of how love is presented through the ages.
Autumn Term	Completing NEA (Non Exam Assessment) An independent choice of text (must be written pre-1900) by students to compare with <i>The Bloody Chamber</i> in a written essay with an independently chosen title and area of focus.
Spring Term	 A study of Carol Ann Duffy's <i>Feminine Gospels</i> as part of Paper 2: Texts in shared contexts. A study of Ken Kesey's <i>One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest</i> as part of Paper 2: Texts in shared contexts.
Summer Term	Examination preparation and revision of all key texts covered. Recap of key skills needed for both papers, including unseen poetry and unseen prose practice.
How is progress measured?	Regular Teacher Assessments at the end of every half term at least. Progress Checks at various timetabled points of the year. Mock Exams at scheduled points in the year.
How is the subject externally examined? (KS4 and KS5)	Paper 1:Love through the ages. Study of three texts. Examination will include two unseen poems Assessed. Written exam: 3 hours. 40% of A-level.Paper 2:Texts in shared contexts. Study of three texts: one prose, one poetry, and one drama. Examination will include an unseen prose extract. Written exam: 2 hours 30 minutes - open book 40% of A-level.Non-exam assessment:Independent critical study: texts across time Comparative critical study of two texts, at least one of which must have been written pre-1900. One extended essay (2500 words) and a bibliography. 20% of A-level. Assessed by teachers. Moderated by AQA.
Extending Learning at home	Homework tasks set regularly to extend classroom study or to conduct independent reading of scholarly articles and critics' views and feedback in class.
Support Available	One to One tutorials in preparing for NEA. Regular marking and feedback of class and homework.
