Year Group: 10 Subject: PSHE and Citizenship

Objectives	Personal, social, health and economic education (PSHE) and citizenship enables children to become healthy, independent and responsible members of society. The programme of study aims to develop skills and attributes such as resilience, self-esteem, risk-management, teamworking and critical thinking in the context of learning grouped into three core themes: health and wellbeing, relationships and living in the wider world (including economic wellbeing and aspects of careers education).
Autumn Term	Citizenship – Students are able to cover a wide range of Citizenship issues such as Human Rights, Community Cohesion, Being British, Asylum Seekers, Politics and Voting
Spring Term	PSHE – Students have the opportunity to learn about a variety of important issues and life skills such as: Domestic Violence, Healthy Relationships, Sexting, Becoming a Parent, Contraception and STI's
Summer Term	Careers – As part of this programme of study students will cover a range of issues such as Labour Market Information, Skills and Qualities, Writing a CV and Cover Letter, Applying for jobs and Interview Skills
