Objectives The K33 Science Curriculum at Bramcote College follows the National Curriculum to provide the foundations for understanding the world through the disciplines of Biology, Chemistry and Physics. The content delivered across years 7 – 9 is designed to develop scientific knowledge and conceptual understanding through the disciplines of Biology, Chemistry and Physics. This will allow students to develop an understanding of the nature, processes and methods of science through different types of scientific enquiries to enable them to answer scientific questions about the world around them. We aim to ensure that students are equipped with the scientific knowledge required to understand the uses and implications of science, today and for the future. Biology 1 – Porticles and The Periodic Table Physics 1 – Forces, Motion and Pressure Biology 2 – Reproduction and Variation Chemistry 2 – Simple Chemical Reactions and Acids & Alkalis Physics 2 – Energy and Space How is progress measured? Students will sit an End of Unit Test made up of short answer questions and an Extended Writing PIN Assessment for each unit studied. They will sit 6 of each across the year.
