

2. Which year is your child currently in?



8. Has your child ever been subject to bullying or abuse from other children, which was reported to the school?





Communication between parents and teachers (newsletter)


- Need for better communication if fixtures cancelled
- If parents can't attend parents' evening how can they check progress of their child?
- More parents' evenings like primary school
- Would like more communication with form tutor
- Earlier notification of food ingredients needed

Curriculum Balance

- Pupils in KS3 are on rotation for all technology areas if pupils have an in-year admission, they might have missed a subject
- We need a minimum number of pupils to run classes. This year we have only had to drop 2 subjects from the list.
- We follow the RSE guidance for teaching in schools. Our updated policy is on the website. We have also written a gender-identity policy which makes it clear that staff should not promote own views on gender identity.

Communication between parents and teachers (newsletter)

- Agreed to send text message asap
- Progress can be seen on MCAS with twice yearly written reports
- In primary school class teachers have 2-3 parents evening for 30 pupils one class. In secondary school, teachers may teach up to 7 year groups.
- We will ask Tutors to send a termly email to parents to connect, inform and build relationship

MCAS App – Sanctions and rewards

Standards/behaviour

- All teachers teach in specialist areas other than citizenship

Canteen/Food

- We have a contract with a new provider
- Student voice indicates pupils like the food on offer
- Costs have increased both in and out of school, but we are raising this again with the new provider
- Fruit is available at every sitting
- We have asked for the provider to update parents on food options and work with a focus group in school to gain views/opinions

Uniform and lockers

- Expectations are clear. Support to parents who financially ask/need
- Clean/new uniform available to loan and through the Swap Shop
- Re-issue uniform guidance (the website and student handbook are up to date – the PE kit can now include either a plain black sweatshirt or plain back joggers/leggings – logos no bigger than a credit card size – the only compulsory item is the WHP t-shirt


