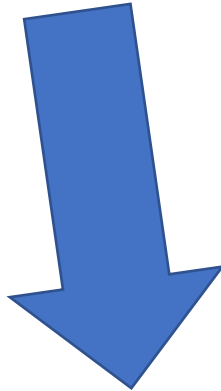

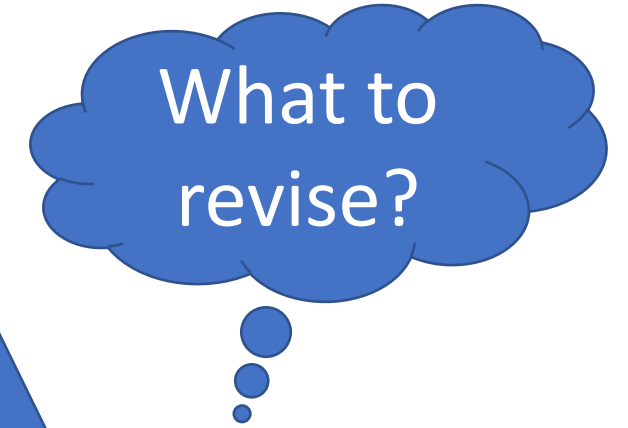

What to
revise?

Key verbs

- Be able to apply past, present and future.
- Learn to talk about themselves as a priority.
- Being able to talk about someone else will increase their final level.
- For higher, the **we** form is also important.



How to revise?

Record it

Record themselves on their phone or tablet.



Teach it!

Teach you the key facts/words.

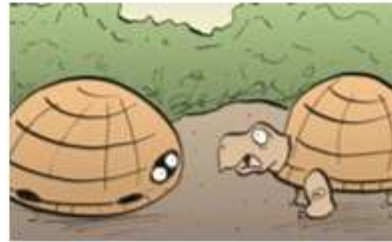


Flashcards

Write the key words/phrases/grammar fact on one side and the explanation/translation on the other. You could test their memory.

Post-Its

Using a pack of post-its, think of a topic and write out as many keywords as they can remember in only 1 minute.



Hide and Seek

Read through their Knowledge Organiser, put it down and try to write out as much as they can remember. Then, keep adding until it is full.

Some students remember words by simply writing them over and over again.

Read aloud

Simply speak the words or phrases out loud as you're reading the Knowledge Organiser/vocab lists. Even try to act it out – it really helps us to remember!



Sketch it!

Draw pictures to represent each of the new words. It could be a simple drawing or something that remind them of their answer.
